## Marsabit - northern Kemya

Greetings. "Is your peace strong?" This is the most common greeting that the Gabra people give to one another. An appropriate one for the advent season as well as we wait for the Prince of Peace! We are so very pleased this year to have found Kindfund. Over the past 7 years we, as a family - David, BJ, Chuluke, Jesse and Roba - have been living side by side with nomadic pastoralists; sharing our lives with them and trying to follow Jesus in being and speaking the good news. We have been moving with our camels, sheep and goats together with our Gabra neighbors. BJ's veterinary profession speaks to the heart of the Gabra as she has specialized in camels, and David's profession of development, sustainable energy, and water resources development, which is crucial to keeping livestock, have been in some demand. The mobile experience has been rich and intense and we have learned so much. It has been a rare privilege to share the lives of such tough, resilient people who survive and even thrive in one of the harshest areas on earth.

We have been praying about future directions and praying to know God's path for the future. Over the years, as we have cared for little Roba (a mentally and physically handicapped Kenyan boy now c.13 yrs old), we have sensed God telling us to be more involved with the disabled and other marginalized people. Because of Roba, we have had many requests to assist with other disabled children who are either abandoned or whose family, for various reasons, are unable to look after them. We feel that God has been leading us to share our lives with more children than Roba and to that end we had been exploring various options.

We own some land on the outskirts of Marsabit and we had thought to settle on the land and spend some time reflecting, writing and processing the lessons learned from the last number of nomadic years. We have been thinking of developing our land as a permaculture farm with various animals and vegetables which could feed the home and also help to bring in an income. We also feel that this would help the kids develop skills and be able to help with the farm in whatever way they can manage - a healing activity for them. It was by "God's happy accident" we feel, that we bumped into Pamela and Ken a few months ago as we travelled from Nairobi to Marsabit. In addition to the God who leads us, we also owe that to Vera, who was working with Kindfund at that time. She wanted us to stay with her in Isiolo town with our 13 chickens and 2 wild cats! It was Vera then who led us to Kindfund. In November, with some financial help from Kindfund, we began to build a home for ourselves and up to five disabled children. The home, in order to contain costs, will be built using a mix of traditional building materials and more innovative products (earth bags). When we have it complete we will include a photograph in a future issue. Kindfund is also helping us on a monthly basis with some of the special needs for Roba.

We are quite excited about what God is doing as we work and plan together with Kindfund to fulfil the vision he has given us for the project at Marsabit.

### Robert, Lucinda and their son Jaden

Because only a very few Samburu and some other pastoralist tribes in Northern Kenva have heard the gospel, babies who are born outside of what are culturally accepted practices are considered "outcasts" and unwanted. These children are usually killed by crude abortion, poisoned, or they are abandoned in the bush to die of exposure and by wild animals. God protected my son Jaden and He is using Kindfund and other locals within these communities to rescue these and other at-risk children.

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." Jeremiah 29:11

Catherine (a local woman) explained to me how she rescued Jaden. She said, "Some children told me they saw two babies lying in the lagga (dry riverbed) two days earlier. I went there the next day. After lying in the lagga for three days, Jaden was still alive but his twin brother was dead. Jaden was cold and shivering, covered in sand, and his breathing was very shallow. I took him home (a hut), cleaned him, and gave him goats milk mixed with water, sugar, and salt. After a week his breathing was still not good so I took him to the orphanage (a full day's journey)." He weighed just 2 1/2 pounds! Today, Jaden is a healthy and handsome 10 year old boy who is lots of fun to be with. He has a funny sense of humor and he is a very good swimmer! Sometimes I look at him and I think about the tough beginning he had and the beautiful, healthy boy he has become. Thank you, God, for protecting him and for the plans You have for his future! ## Memories of a journey

The journey began in October 2014 as the Kindfund Outreach Tour came to a close and I started to ask God, "What next?" in relation to supporting the work of Kindfund.

Under the leadership of Jonathan Dobbin, we met to praise, worship, pray and seek God for insight in relation to plans for taking a team out the next summer. God was faithful to direct and guide us, just as He has promised in His word. As we acknowledged our own weakness, He met us with Grace and moved us along, encouraging us as doors slowly began to open, to move plans forward to become a

So, to finally be heading to Kindfund with a team of 8 on 29 July was the end of one journey and the beginning of another. To liken it to the faith required for stepping out of the boat and walking on water would indeed help you identify with my sense of awe at how far God was taking me in faith with Him.

Once in Kenya the 8 became 10 as my daughter Katie and Robert joined us. They had arrived earlier in the summer to work with Kindfund. It was so good to have their energy and commitment as we learned and worked together.

I think it is fair to say each one of the team felt very aware of our own inadequacy, but was ready to be used by God; not quite sure what we were letting ourselves in for, yet trusting God to make it work for His glory.

It was an incredible work He did in all of our own lives as we made this journey. This was such a surprise, for we signed up to serve and ended up being blessed, growing in our faith and understanding of our Creator and His ability and enabling. Growing also into a sense of one another, the family of God, brothers and sisters in Christ. Despite my faith in Ephesians 3:20, I had not imagined He would do such a work in our own lives. But He did and we were incredibly moved and blessed as a result. It is fair to say God has used this journey to surpass anything I could have hoped for or imagined, just as in Ephesians 3:20, he is able to do exceedingly abundantly more.

It is not hard to single out one thing that stands out from my trip - the children. The Kindfund children come from so many different backgrounds, each one with a story to tell. They have faced so many difficulties in their young lives, yet their smiles could melt the coldest of hearts. I will not forget the hope of the children of Kindfund. They take you into their hearts and you are overcome with love for them. How good it was to be able to share God's love with them.

I loved the times when we sought God at the 5am prayer meetings during the week of the Bible Camp. As we poured out our hearts to God and asked Him to shower the Kindfund family with his blessing and to use them in turn to bless Kenya and her people. This continues to be my prayer.

The work of the Bible Camp, the team's willingness to serve and to be pushed and stretched outside their comfort zones to produce an effective work filled me with praise and thanksgiving. Not only for the team from Northern Ireland but for the Kindfund managers, staff, older youth, and teens, as we worked together to deliver a pleasing and successful bible camp.

Since returning home I have been savouring the blessings and enjoying the memories with thanksgiving. I have discovered a new depth of fellowship with my creator and with the body of Christ; I have grown in faith and grown in prayer. I have seen Him to be faithful.

Since our departure from Kenya, the team has reunited to share in our 3 churches something of what God did in those days in Kenya. West Presbyterian Church Bangor, Tubrid Church of Ireland, and Magheramason Presbyterian Church heard us tell of the work of Kindfund, the Lord's goodness and the transforming power of God.

Today, however, is a new day; to be about His work for His glory. To hope once more to shine His light, to herald His Kingdom come and His will to be done.
